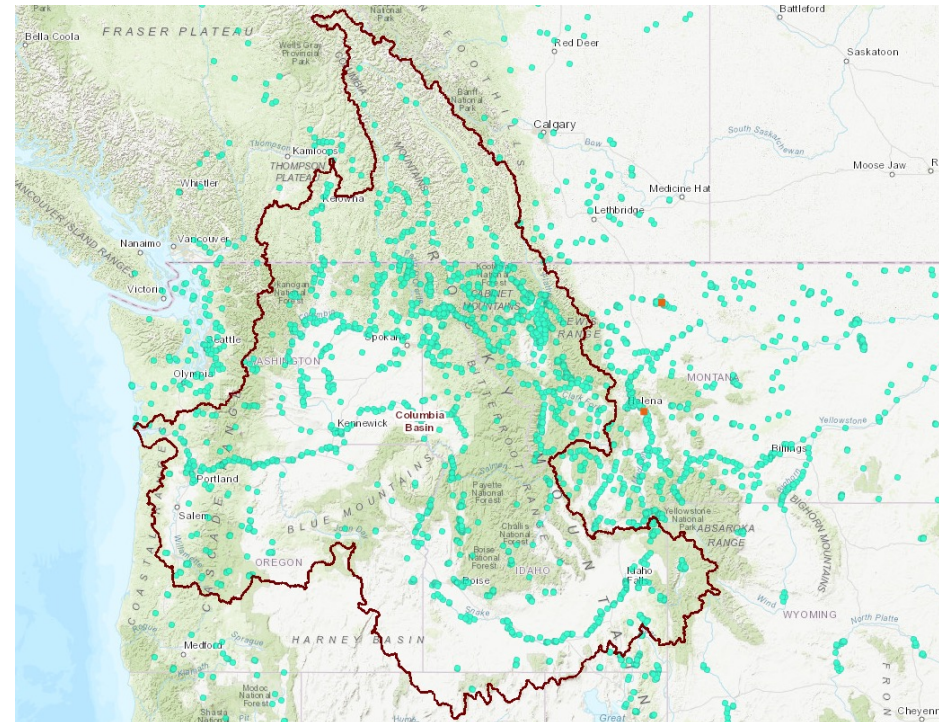

# Goals and Objectives

## Goal of coordinated CRB dreissenid mussel monitoring

To protect the Columbia River Basin from the establishment and spread of dreissenid mussels.

Objectives: 1) Improved probability of detecting dreissenid mussel infestations in the CRB, 2) Decreased probability of spread of dreissenid mussels across jurisdictions within the CRB, and 3) Increased efficacy of control and quarantine strategies if dreissenid mussels are detected.



# Goals and Objectives

## Goal of early detection monitoring for dreissenid mussels in the CRB

- *To enable the effective implementation of rapid response plans, treatment, and containment measures.*
