- New watercraft inspection signs to increase visibility, awareness and improve compliance



Hours of Operation	5 days/week & 7hrs/day	7 days/week & 10hrs/day	9 stations dawn-dusk 7 days/week, 1 station 24hrs	1 station 24hrs, 5 dawn to dusk, 6 10hrs/day
Inspection Season	June- October	April to Sept/Oct	April/June to mid November	April to end of Sep and Oct

2018 Watercraft Inspections

- ~4,000 inspections to date
- 200 high risk boats
- 45 decontaminations performed
- 8 mussel fouled boats
 - Advanced notification for 7
 - From POE, AB, ID, MB, ANS alerts




Compliance at Inspection Stations

- Average compliance at inspection stations was 76% for 2017
- 75% of watercraft failing to stop at inspection stations are non-motorized










Challenge: Number of Port of Entries



Success

- 2017: program received ~300 notifications from POE's
- To date in 2018 program has already received & responded to 80 notifications from CBSA



Challenge: Water testing of new boats

- Several manufacturers water testing new boats in high risk waters and immediately shipped
- Large number of new boats destined for interior BC
- Requires follow up
- Can there be an accepted standard for water testing new boats?
