All Hands on Deck Survey

Multiagency Effort

Extra effort during pre-spawn period to remove fish before they spawn




2023 All Hands Survey

- Highest density of Pike was in Gifford and 6-Mile Creek Areas
- Captured one in the Sanpoil
- Deep drawdowns and extra drawdowns for salmon not good for suppression
 - Reduce access during the spring
- High flows will likely increase entrainment




May 21, 2023 - Grand Coulee Dam



Lake Roosevelt Suppression and Distribution

- Since 2015, co-managers have removed 19,248 Northern Pike
 - Approx. 2,500 nets are set each year
- Additional 2022 surveys
 - Colville Tribes added a Rufus Woods gillnet survey, no Pike
 - Spokane Tribe added a Little Falls reservoir survey, no pike
 - WDFW conducted annual Lake
 Spokane Pike suppression efforts
- 2023 new work
 - Colville Tribes will be implementing an acoustic telemetry study to determine habitat use during the summer months when catch rates are low
