







2016 Summary of Watercraft Inspections and All Decontaminations

OF INVASIVE NORTHERN PIKE



Northern Pike (Esox lucius) are a Prohibited Species in Oregon. Anglers are encouraged to kill all Northern Pike



encountered, do not release them back into the water. Harvested Northern Pike must be dead before anglers leave the water where they are caught.

NO MINIMUM SIZE OR POSSESSION LIMIT

Northern Pike are currently not present anywhere in Oregon and with your help we can keep it that way. This



fish species is known to have negative impacts on native fish populations and popular sport fisheries. In addition, further spread of Northern Pike from their present location in the upper Columbia River Basin

into downstream portions of the Columbia River pose a severe threat to Salmon and Steelhead recovery efforts.

It is illegal to transport and release live fish into Oregon waters without an ODFW permit.
